What is it?

Quite simply, my device reinvents the wheel, in regards to the modern day Joystick or (Hand held video game controller). It's no secret that the video game market seems to be unstoppable. The PS3 from Sony, The Xbox 360 from Microsoft, and the Wii from Nintendo are the three big video game consoles. Combat and war strategy games have become the biggest genre to have exploded on the market place. Call of Duty (Modern Warfare) is already the biggest selling cross platform game of all time. My device solves an actual need that is generally thought to be not possible to fix.

I have invented the world's first integrated joystick or built in wireless motion controller. It is not limited one hand, therefore is ambidextrous in operation. The current pistol configuration dictates you must attach a joystick the game controller. This spoils the illusion of holding a real pistol. One hand must hold the pistol shaped game controller and the other must hold the joystick. This obviously spoils the belief you are holding a pistol. The joystick is what enables the player to maneuver around the game freely, hence this allows the element of strategy. This is easy to hide in a large device, like a machine gun peripheral. But a pistol has limited or no room to disguise it.

All video game manufacturers are heading towards gaming controllers that work similar to Nintendo's Wii. The Wii's remote can be anything you want it to be. A baseball bat, a bowling ball, a machine gun, or in this case a pistol. The game controller is placed inside the replicated device. The huge problem peripheral makers can't seem to overcome, is hiding the Joystick that is attached to the controller. That was until I came along. I call it "Attachment free video game weaponry"
